# Bolero



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Too warm for a 'big coat'?

Need something to take the chill off?

This easy to sew Bolero is the answer to your prayers!

Whether you want a casual cover up or a fancy addition to a night out, this stylish inclusion to your wardrobe will suit every need.

Can be made on all baby lock overlockers and combination machines.

## Materials

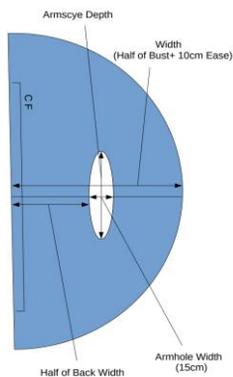
- Pattern
- Fabric
- Lining fabric (if lining)
- Threads- Plain or Decorative
- Beads, Binding, Lace- options for different finishes.

## Tools

- **Tape measure**
- **Pattern paper**
- **Cutting mat**
- **Rotary cutter/Scissors**

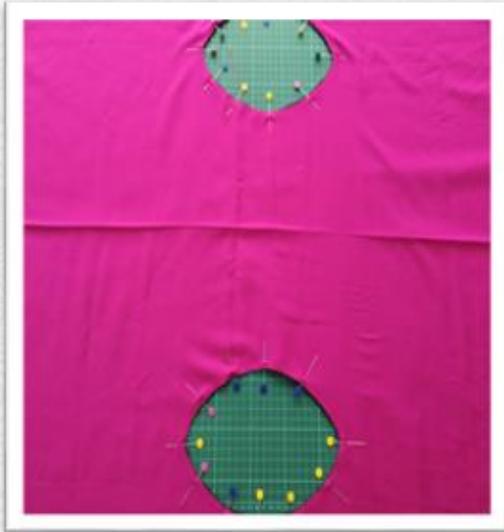


- Using your own body measurements, draft the pattern using the diagram on the left.
- If your bust measurement exceeds the width of your folded fabric, open fabric out and cut 2 separate pieces and join. Remember to add seam allowance.

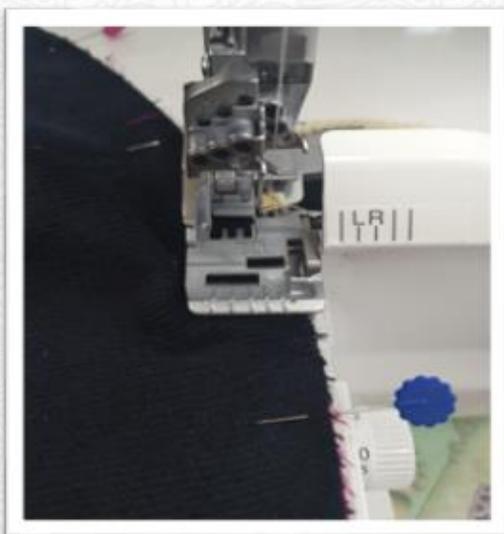


- Test on scraps of your chosen fabric the finish you would like.
- Here are some examples of how to finish the raw edges.

- If using one layer of fabric, stay stitch the edge to avoid stretching.
- Then move onto to finishing the edges.
- If using lining, place the main fabric and lining wrong sides together.
- Line up the armholes, pin or fuse these together before stay stitching.



- With your machine set up for your desired stitch, place the fabric under the foot.
- Line up the edge of your fabric with the edge of the machine, this will allow the knife to trim off any excess or uneven edges.
- Slowly stitch, remember as you're working with a large piece of fabric to take the weight of it so that it doesn't pull away from the needles. [The baby lock extension tables](#) or better yet, the baby lock work stations are ideal for helping with this problem.
- Using the same method as the armholes, pin, fuse or stay stitch the outer edge.
- Again, line up the edge of the fabric with the edge of your machine and stitch all the way round.





- Here is your finished Bolero!
